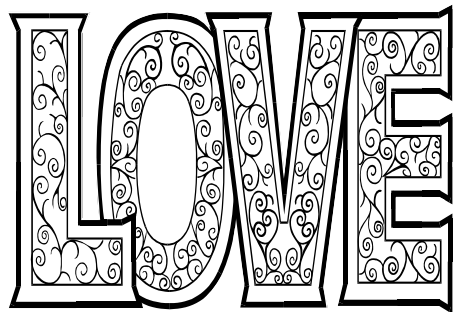
The judge leaned forward in his chair and simply said, "Obviously, your client is too confused to know about, or to celebrate, the atheists' holiday!"

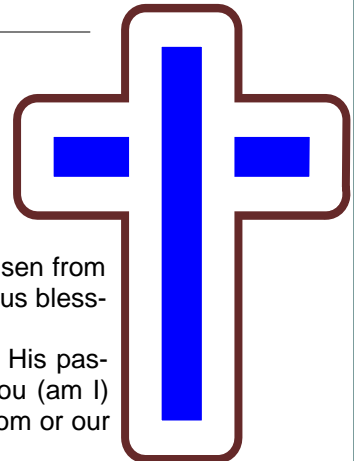
From The Spiritual Director
