- Work actively to support the pilgrim, before, during and after the Walk.
- Do not take sponsorship responsibilities lightly or carry them out casually or haphazardly.
- Pray extensively, with diligent thought, careful planning and follow through.

Hello Beautiful Emmaus People!!

Scripture tells us that Jesus was a man "acquainted with sorrow, knowing disappointment and tears" Isaiah 53, Hebrews 5. I've often wondered how disappointed Jesus was when after teaching his disciples for 3 years the ways of the heavenly kingdom, and on his last night as a human saw them begin to dispute over which one was the greatest.

In the face of this disappointment Jesus speaks in Luke 22. 25-29. The essence of those words are in verse 22. "But let him who is the greatest among you become as the youngest, and the leader as the servant." In the past few weeks as a community, we've all felt the disappointment of having to cancel Men's Emmaus Walk #12 because of the lack of pilgrims. In our last team meeting, we, as well as Roger Cheesbro, chairperson of the board, sat down to process the best we could our feelings as a group. What could we have done differently? What's the next step?

First of all, we were in unanimous agreement that even though things didn't work out as we'd hoped, we all experienced a new sense of unity and spiritual growth through our commitment to meet and become a team in this endeavor as brothers in Christ. It was truly wonderful and a bit scary at times! Secondly, we all agreed that one of the saddest things for God to see is when his people hold on to disappointments, blaming themselves and others, not learning anything about themselves and God's Grace because of an event.

With that said, it's significant that we as a community note Jesus' words in this particular time of disappointment. He focuses on serving! "Let those who are the greatest among you become as the youngest, and the leader as the servant."

Have you noticed the dynamic that quite often exhibited by the "youngest" member of a group? They're fresh, excited, and "a rarin' to go". The older members quite often grin, wink, and nudge one another, saying, "Let em' loose and thank God they're grabbing hold cause' I've paid my dues in this thing and I'm backing off."

There may be times that we "back off" serving on an Emmaus week-end, or even going to gatherings or connecting to a reunion group, but we should never get so old that we forget that as disciples our lives will always be about the process of "sponsoring" others to get to know God better. As disciples, we're constantly about establishing certain spiritual processes in our lives to make heaven's business of saving souls successful. All of our lives we set our hearts to be about God's business of polishing and refining our skills to help others become more firmly established in their faith. That's the main reason I'm committed to Emmaus. It's a tool to make others successful for God through my service.

What's next? We're planning to have Men's Emmaus Walk #12 Fall 2006. In the meantime, God always would have us enlarging and sharpening our mental and spiritual processes for expanding and strengthening His Kingdom on earth. He'd have us pray about Him opening doors to help us see those he knows who are hungry for a new life. (even when maybe we can't initially tell it). He'd have us be intentional about beginning to make a list of people we daily target prayerfully for salvation and spiritual growth to be mighty in God. God tells us in Romans 8.28: "He causes all things to work together for our good". This is specifically for "those who love Him and are called according to His purposes." As a community we love the Lord and open ourselves in new ways to serve Him.
